On the occasion of Janjatiya Gaurav Divas (Birth anniversary of Birsa Munda), the department of Business Studies has organized declamation competition on **“Untold Stories of unsung freedom fighters”** on 15th Nov, 2022 for students under chairperson Dr. Manisha Goel. Dr. Pallavi Mahajan, Faculty, Department of Business Studies coordinated the event along with students of B.com(H) Bhawna

and Tamanna, members of commerce club. The students participated in the event with great zeal and enthusiasm.



The students of B.com (H) presented the stories of Birsa Munda, Alluri Sitarama Raju, Shaheed Veer Narayan, Sidhu and Kanhu Murmu, Tirot Singh, Jhalkari Bai, Rani Gaidinliu, Nilamber and Piamber, Govind Guru, Tilka Majhi; and Telanga Kharia. Birsa Munda was born on 15th November, 1875 in Jharkhand. His mother's name was Karma Hatu and his father's name was Sugana Munda. Birsa Munda wanted to get the real right of the tribal people. He fought against britishers for their rights and thus kept in jail of Ranchi. He was arrested on 3rd February, 1900. There he was subjected to severe tortures. At last he died at the age of 25 years. Birsa Munda received his education in Salga under the guidance of his teacher Jaipal Nagar. Later, Birsa Munda converted into a christian to join the German mission school but soon dropped out after finding out the Britishers were aiming to convert tribals to christianity through education. BIRSA MUNDA is known for challenging the christian missionaries & revolting against the conversion activities along with the Munda and oraon communities.

Veer Narayan singh was born on 1796 in Chhattisgarh. He was hanged at Jaistambh chowk in Raipur, Chhattisgarh. He is also known as "The first Chhattisgarhi freedom fighter. Chhattisgarh named a cricket stadium Shaheed Veer Narayan Singh International Cricket Stadium after his name.



Tilka Majhi was born on 11th February, 1750 in Sultanganj, Bihar. He was born in a small village called Tilakpur. He lived in the shadow of a forest civilization and hunted wild animals. Since childhood, he has seen the tyranny of English people on his family and on the tribal people. English rulers had their rights on the poor tribe's cultivated land and wild trees. Tribal people, children, women, old men were greatly tortured by the Britishers. Tilka started a rebellion against the Britishers. He led the famous revolt of the Tribals against the British from 1771 to 1784.

Rani gaidinliu, was born on 26th January 1915 and died on 17 February 1993 at the age of 78 in longkao village of Manipur. She was the naga spiritual and political leader who works against the British rulers. At the age of 13 she joined heraka religious movements which were later turned into a political moment seeking to drive out the British from Manipur and surrounding Naga region. She was arrested in 1932 at the age of 16, Pt. Jawahar lal Nehru met her at Shillong jail in 1937 and promised her to release. He also gave her the title of Rani.

Kanhu Murmu and his brother Sidhu Murmu were the pioneers of the Santhal Rebellion of 1855-56. They were born in this province, which was totally under the

spell of the British. Both belonged to a town called Bhognadih in the Sahibganj district.

On June 30, 1855 Santhals group decide to meet to discuss the corruption and racism caused by the capitalist practices of money lenders. These two brave martyrs were captured by the British and then killed in captivity. But it marks a phenomenal change in the history of Santhals, especially during colonial rule. This day is still celebrated and is dedicated to martyrdom in the state of Jharkhand. Seeing his contribution to the early history of the struggle for freedom, Kanhu Murmu is undoubtedly an anonymous hero who helped the oppressed Santhals gain a different identity.
