

MoU with Aurel Vlaicu University, Romania

In order to establish and promote international relations of the University in educational, technical, Research and cultural domains, J.C. Bose University of Science and Technology, YMCA, Faridabad signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Aurel Vlaicu University of Arad, Romania on Nov. 9, 2019.

The aim for signing of MoU with AVU is to support of academic partnerships with the university which include research collaboration, the exchange of faculty, researchers, students, publications, academic programs and collaborative research projects.

Prof. Valentina gave a detailed presentation about AVU, its academic programs and international activities, especially the joint programs with a number of international universities. She pointed out the importance of collaborative efforts between the two parties through the establishment of lectures, seminars, scientific conferences, various training courses in areas of shared interest, in addition to holding workshops in the fields of IT, Engineering and Management.

A brief presentation about J. C. Bose University and its available academic programmes was also given on this occasion.

Vice Chancellor Prof. Dinesh Kumar said that international cooperation plays an important role in building a globally competent academic and research system in a University and J.C. Bose University has been working towards strengthening its international tie-ups so as to further fostering advancement in teaching, learning and research.

The exchange programme between both the institutions would provide an opportunity to faculty members, researchers and students of both the institutions to learn and experience from the international environment, he added.
